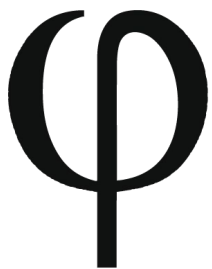

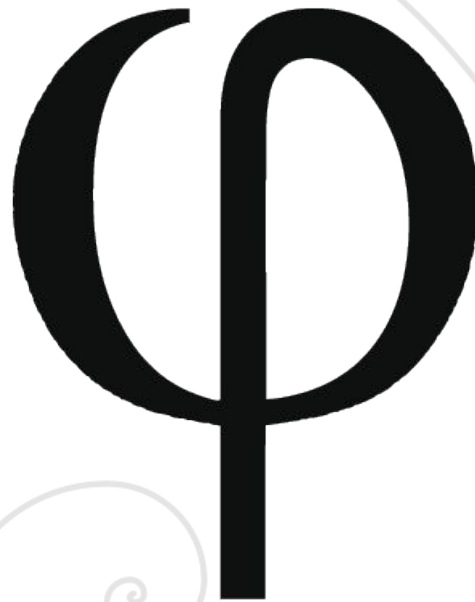


Description

A bed frame is a foundational structure designed to support a mattress and, often, a box spring. It provides elevation, ensuring the mattress is off the ground, aiding in cleanliness and airflow. Frames come in various styles and sizes, tailored for single to king-sized mattresses. Common types include platform, slatted, canopy, and poster frames.



Bed frames originated as simple raised platforms, elevating sleepers from cold, drafty floors and pests. Over time, in different cultures, these structures evolved in complexity and design. In ancient civilizations, like Egypt and Rome, they became status symbols, with the elite showcasing ornate frames made of precious materials.

History



What is the standard height of a bed frame?

The height of a standard mattress and bed frame ranges from 18"-36" | 46-91 cm. Modern beds are around 18" | 46 cm, common beds are 25" | 64 cm, and old-fashioned antique beds are often 36" | 91 cm from the floor.

Is it ok to sleep on a mattress on the floor?

There is no direct risk of putting a mattress on the floor, but mattresses that sit directly on the floor may be exposed to larger amounts of dust and may absorb greater moisture because of the restricted airflow.

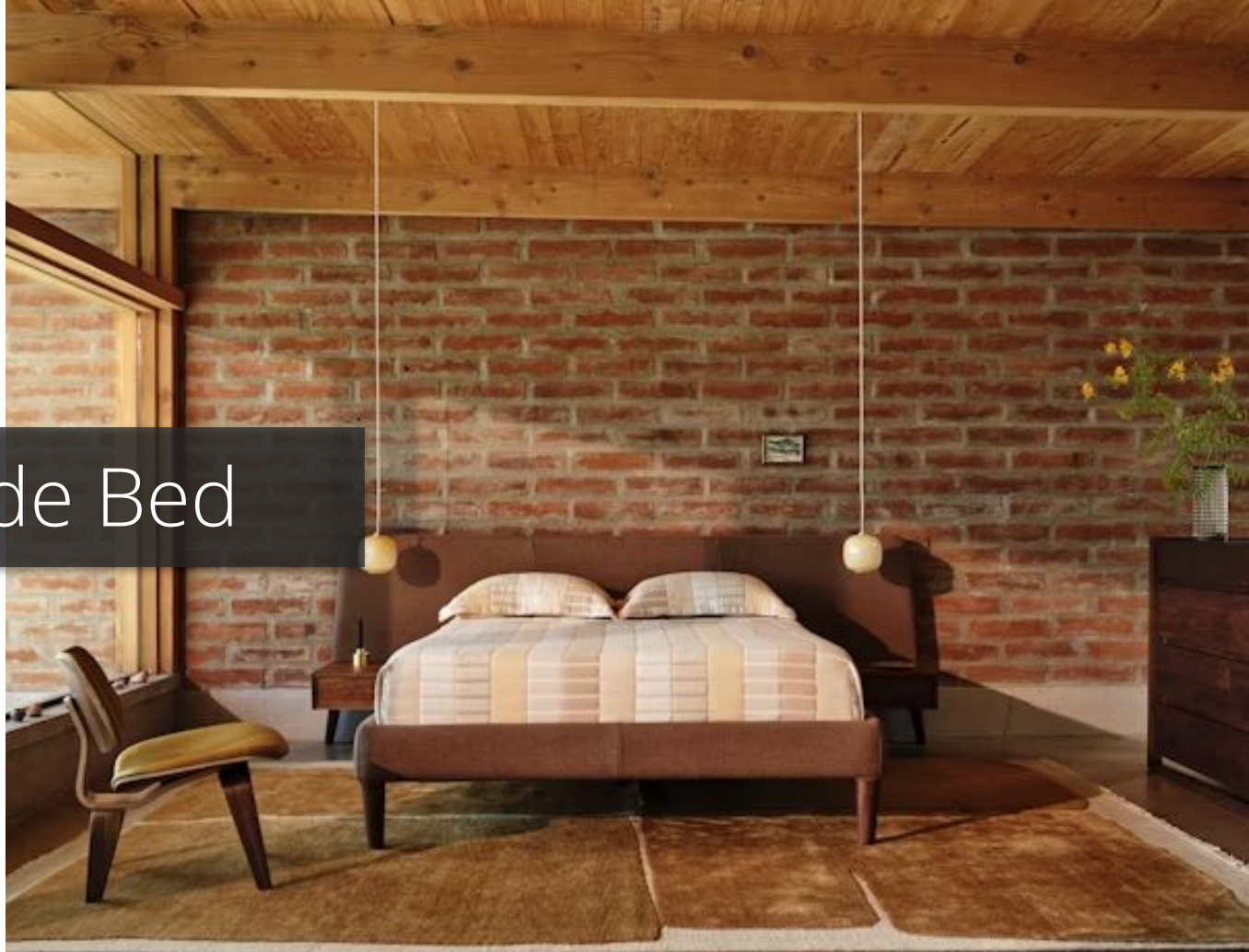
What are the advantages of having a bed frame?

Bed frames provide greater bed support for a better sleep, can add style and design to your bedroom, and can also provide additional storage space through optional drawers.

Description

Dining tables are central furniture pieces where people gather to share meals, conversations, and create memories. Typically rectangular, they come in various shapes like round, square, or oval, suiting different room sizes and aesthetics. Materials range from classic wood to modern glass, metal, and even stone. Depending on the design, some dining tables are extendable, allowing more seating when needed.

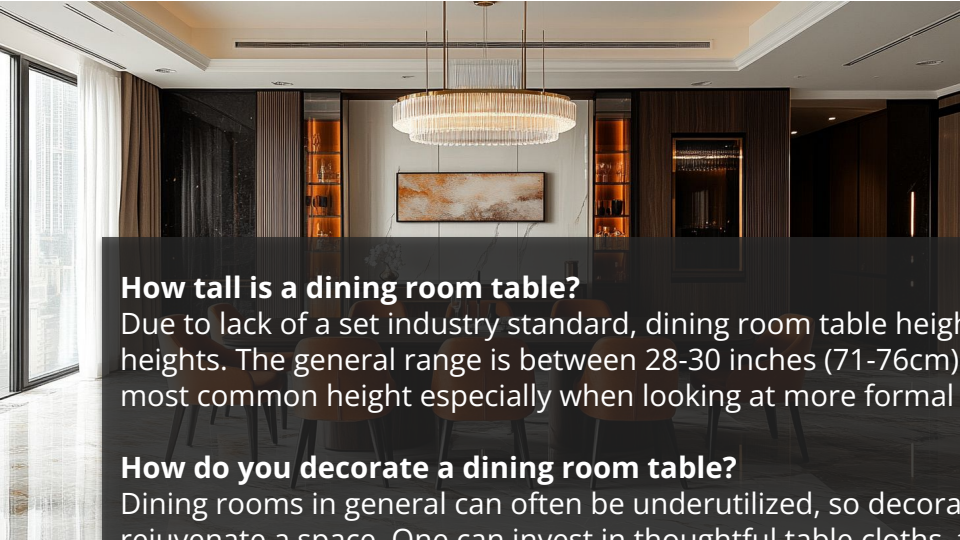


Dining tables trace their roots to ancient civilizations where simple platforms were used for communal meals. Over time, in medieval Europe, they became grander, often showcasing status in noble homes. The Renaissance period saw intricate designs and refinements. By the 18th and 19th centuries, specialized features like expandable sections emerged, accommodating larger gatherings. As societies evolved, so did the dining table, transforming from a mere utility platform to a central piece defining family gatherings and social dynamics.



History





How tall is a dining room table?

Due to lack of a set industry standard, dining room table height is often dependent on average chair heights. The general range is between 28-30 inches (71-76cm) although 30 inches (76cm) is seen as the most common height especially when looking at more formal dining tables.

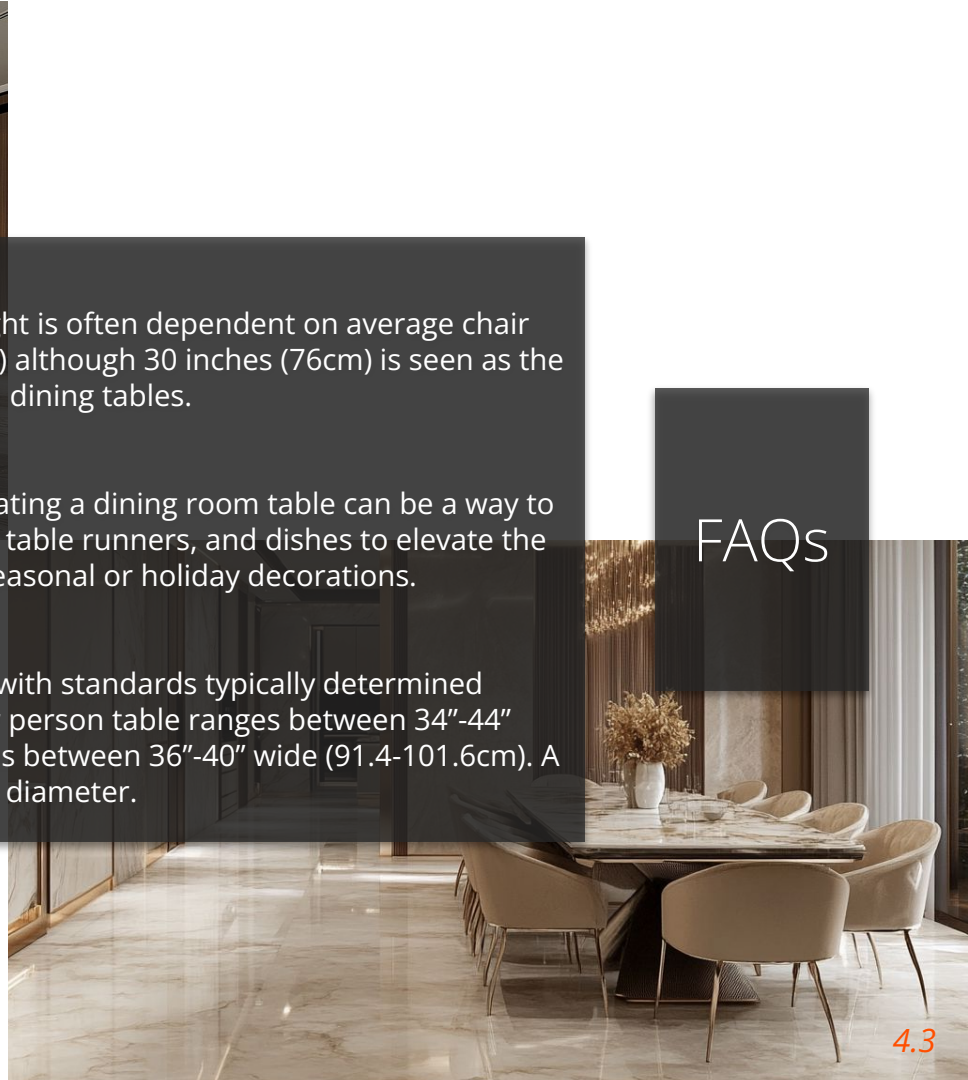
How do you decorate a dining room table?

Dining rooms in general can often be underutilized, so decorating a dining room table can be a way to rejuvenate a space. One can invest in thoughtful table cloths, table runners, and dishes to elevate the dining room. A dining room table can act as a backdrop for seasonal or holiday decorations.

How wide is a dining room table?

The width of a dining room table varies depending on shape with standards typically determined based on the number of people at the table. A square or four person table ranges between 34"-44" wide (86.4-112cm) while a rectangle or six person table ranges between 36"-40" wide (91.4-101.6cm). A round table shares a similar range as the square table, but in diameter.

Dressers & Chests

Description

Dressers, also known interchangeably as chests or bureaus, are furniture pieces made up of multiple stacked drawers for storing items. Most commonly used for holding various clothing items within the bedroom, dressers are multi-functional household pieces use for both the storage of items and for showcasing other items via the top surface.

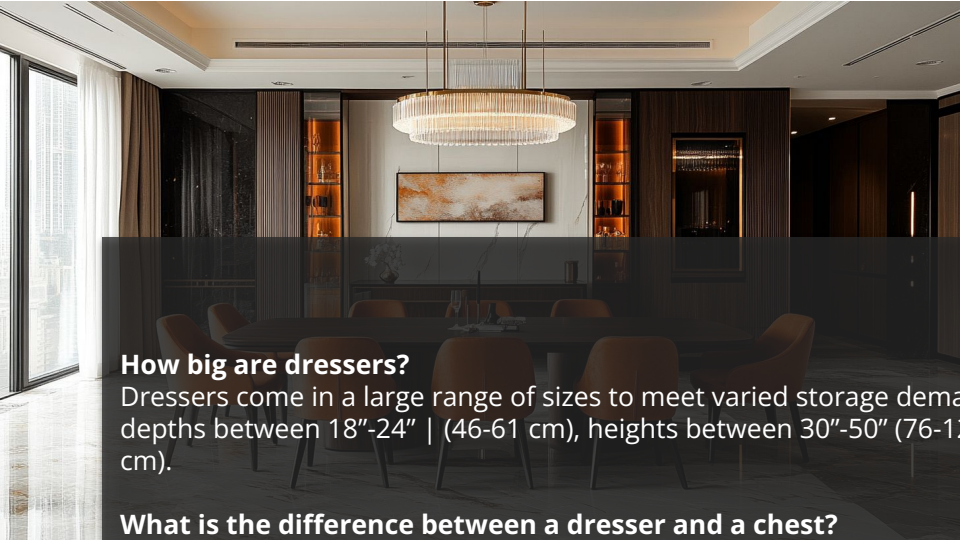


Dressers originated in Europe as early storage solutions for clothing and personal items. Initially, they were simple wooden boxes. From Renaissance onwards, they had evolved into more refined pieces with multiple drawers and intricate designs.

Throughout their evolution, dressers remained central to bedroom furnishings, adapting to changing storage needs and aesthetics.



History



How big are dressers?

Dressers come in a large range of sizes to meet varied storage demands, but dressers commonly have overall depths between 18"-24" | (46-61 cm), heights between 30"-50" (76-127 cm), and widths between 30"-74" (76-188 cm).

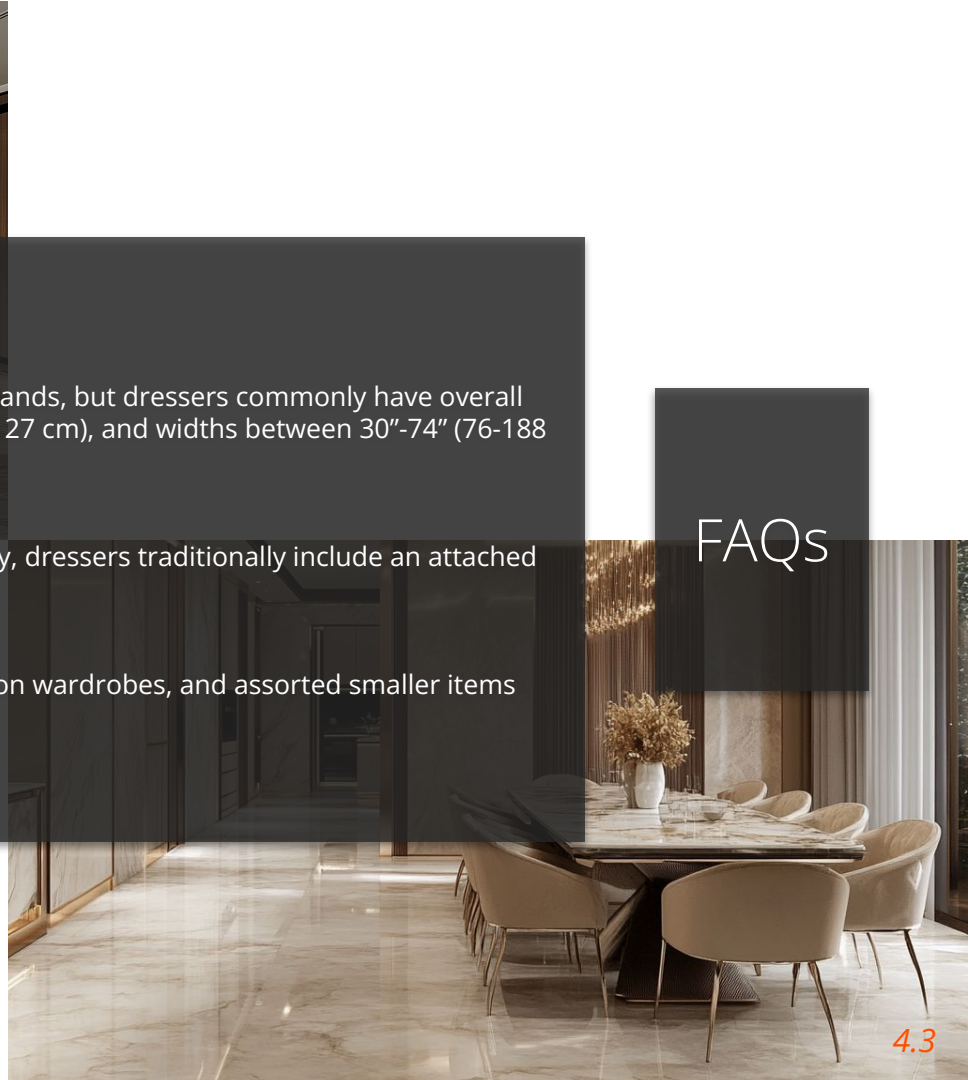
What is the difference between a dresser and a chest?

Though the terms dresser and chest are often used interchangeably, dressers traditionally include an attached top mirror while chests of drawers only include drawers.

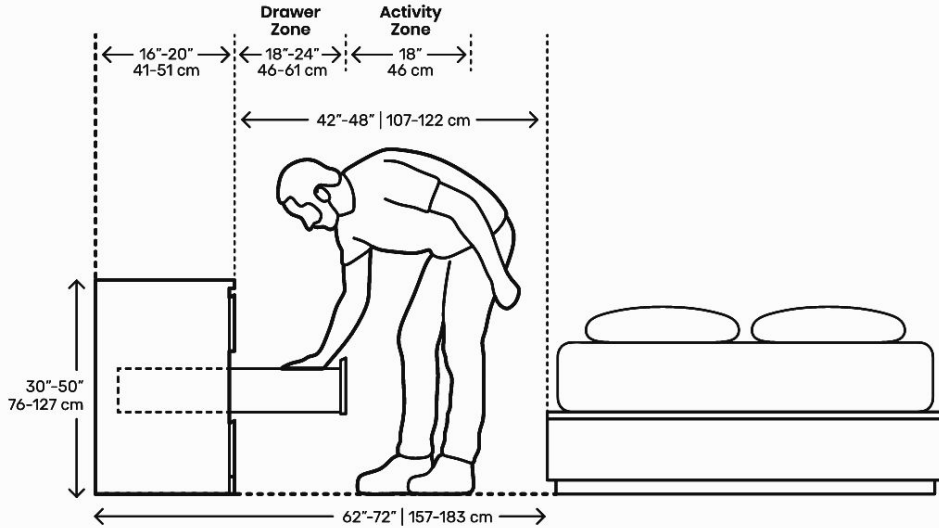
What is stored in a dresser?

Dressers are best suited for storing folded casual clothing, off-season wardrobes, and assorted smaller items such as socks and intimate wear.

During the medieval period, these pieces became status symbols, intricately designed and decorated. By the 19th century, with the rise of built-in closets in homes, armoires transitioned from essential storage to decorative furniture pieces, often showcasing the woodworking skills of craftsmen, and became a staple in homes globally.

History



What is an armoire?

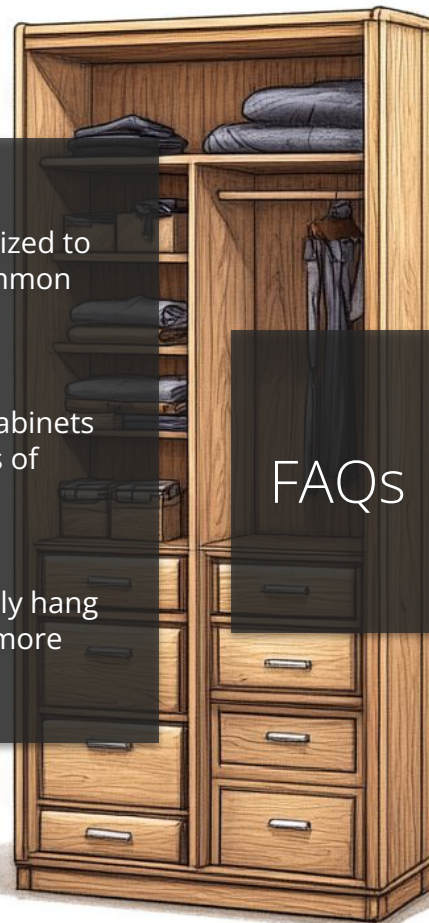
An armoire is a freestanding cabinet that is typically used for storing clothing. Armoires are sized to provide hanging space and often include additional shelves and drawers. Armoires were common pieces of household furniture when closets were not readily built into the layout of a room.

What is an armoire used for?

Armoires today are used primarily for storing clothing, though they were originally used as cabinets for storing arms. Armoires were once viewed as one of the most ornate and signature pieces of furniture in a household, but today their function has largely been replaced by closets.

How deep is an armoire?

Similar to closets, armoires have a recommended depth of 24" (61 cm) in order to comfortably hang clothes on standard sized hangers. Minimum armoire depths of 20" (51 cm) are common in more space efficient armoire designs. Armoire depths typically range from 19.5"-24" (50-61 cm).
